We are thankful that Betsi is showing great interest in studying the Bible and enjoys our worship services. This is Soldany. She was a little girl when we lived in Barquisimeto, Venezuela in the 90s. Her family belonged to our church there. What a wonderful reunion we had with her on Sunday. She has been in Chile for four years and is an active member of our church here. She's another example of someone having to leave all her friends and relatives behind to find work and security because of a communist government.
