Ever since we joined Global Lutheran Outreach, we have been praying for the Lord of the Harvest to send out more laborers into the field. He has answered our prayers, because in June of this year, we received an email from Joe Stoltenow asking questions about our experiences as missionaries with Global Lutheran Outreach.

Joe first came to Cambodia in 2014 to work with the street children of Battambang, Cambodia's second largest city. There he met a young lady by the name of Viya, who was also a Christian and working with the youth of Battambang. In November of last year Joe and Viya tied the knot and were married in Cambodia. In July of this year as husband and wife, Joe and Viya joined Global Lutheran Outreach.



The Stoltenows will continue their work with the street children of Battambang. They will be about an hour's drive to the west southwest of

where we will be in Siem Reap. We have already introduced them to Pastor Hun Kosal at Trinity Lutheran Church in Battambang. We ask that you pay for them as a newly married couple and for their ministry.

History of Global Lutheran Outreach

In June of this year, our director Jim Tino, shared with us in a nutshell the vision and mission of Global Lutheran Outreach as it was

formed in 2010 as we dialogued with Joe and Viya. While this is a review for us, we thought you'd be interested in it hearing about it too, so here it is for you all as well. We love the passion and dedication of our board and director to share Jesus to the world and let us jump on board with them.

“GLO was formed with a different vision for what it means to send missionaries. We believe that missionaries can come from any country of the world, and that God calls people to serve in many ways. We believe that the Church (local congregation, mission organizations, national church body) needs to participate in God’s mission in God’s way. We do not believe that we have “all the answers”, so we work in partnership with others. We value finding a way to say “yes”.

As a result, GLO is an organization that FACILITATES the sending of missionaries. We do not “control” missionaries. GLO provides the reliable, stable, and necessary “home office” functions so that missionaries can focus on what God is calling them to do.

GLO missionaries have a high rate of success in cultural adaptation and effectiveness in their field of service. We believe that this is due not only to the qualities that God has invested in each missionary, but also in the qualities that God has invested in GLO. Our core administrative and leadership team has over 50 years of experience on the mission field. We use that experience to provide the training, support, and services that missionaries need to be effective.”

We have dearly appreciated the guidance and support from the very beginning of our relationship with GLO and even more that the same shoes cannot be worn in every part of the world, and so given the opportunity, God can do wonderful things thru His people anywhere they are sent. It works very well for us in Cambodia.
