Our first week in Addis Ababa: Sept. 15-22, 2019

We arrived in Addis Ababa on September 15, 2019 after a long flight with Lufthansa from Toronto via Frankfurt at around 9:26 pm. While the flight was pleasant all the way from Toronto, it took us another four hours at the Bole International Airport to get through the immigration checking and collecting our luggages. By the time we reach the Bethel Synod Guest House, it was already passed 1:00 am. Thanks to Pastor Tadese Disasa from the Onesimos Nesib Seminary, we were able to get the accommodations and start implementing our plans.

We thank God as during this first week, God has put on our ways Missionaries that have been working in Ethiopia for several years. Agnes and I had the opportunities to chat with them on various challenges that are awaiting us such as learning the basics of the Oromo language, dealing with people, food supplies, weather changes, teaching, the importance of support, ministering to Seminary Students.

What about challenges?

The challenges of the ONS are no different from those of other theological institutions in the African continent. They are: access to the site and disruption of the internet, lack of resources, students' scholarship. The ONS Library needs more books for students. St. Matthew Lutheran Church has donated 118 NIV Bibles for the Seminary that are still kept in Toronto as the cost to ship them to Aira is very high. We are still looking for the cheapest way to ship these Bibles.

From our own perspective, Kalangu and I have been experiencing among others the following challenges before our arrival: Frustrating delays while seeking support, waiting for visas, seeking the interviews with Ethiopian officials in Ottawa that never happened, misunderstanding of people of our cultural background from which we were seeking support, while at the same time having to fulfill the family responsibilities and demands.

MINISTRY UPDATE

Since Sunday September 15, 2019, Agnes and I are in the field in Ethiopia, though not at our final destination, which is the seminary campus in Aira, Wellega, Western Ethiopia. This first week has been very busy as in order to get our work permit, the Authorities have asked us for an additional document that we had not been told about before our arrival. Contacts have been established with partners in Canada, hoping that by next week we will be able to get the document.

We also are very excited that we will be sharing with them our gifts and talents that the Lord had given to us through teaching and social ministry.

We have received encouragement and have thanked our Donors at the Church of St Matthew Lutheran, mentioning how GLO through its Director Dr.Jim Tino and Mission field Supervisor Dale Talsma did manage time and energy to help us get out from Toronto to join the Mission field. A big thank to Pastor Tadese Disasa of ONS who put all the energy and efforts to renovate the house and help us with all the administrative procedures for the visas and work permits.

We thank God for Pastor Derek Pillay who has never stopped to mentor me during this crucial preparation time and the late David Mothersill, a member of St Matthew Lutheran Church who donated 118 Bibles (NIV translation) that we still keep in Toronto and Sister Toini Rua who donated a laptop and a projector for the mission.

Our hope was to arrive in Aira before the beginning of the academic year in September 2018. This has been a long preparation for two years with opportunities and challenges. We thank God for all the help we received and the people He touched to make things happen.
