


## August 2018 STILL SERVING

## Now that I, your LORD and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. (John 13: 14-15)

Two years ago, this month, Austin and I began our marriage with an act of service in front of family and friends. And with no surprise, because God works in the most wonderful of ways, when we returned back to work a few days later we were presented with a brand new ministry opportunity. While we continue to wait to receive our government letter, to work in the government center for children with albinism, we will be working at a new program started by the local Lutheran Church. In short, the Lutheran Church saw a specific need, in this community, of working moms struggling to find people to watch their young children so they decided to open a new day care facility. They also have plans, to hopefully, open a youth center and soccer field. Austin is already in talks with them about how we can help with the youth program.

Their day care opened this Monday and I have been hard at work as a caretaker and leader for this new outreach opportunity. It has been so fun and such a blessing to be able to play and share Jesus with the little ones of our community in Shinyanga. Lots more stories to come...
