The "ordinary" coming of God

And it continues that way. Through ordinary people, humbly, simply, serving.

Like ordinary GLO missionaries.

He came for such as these

Tens of thousands of children have suffered some of the most horrific consequences of the violence brought by the jihadist Boko Haram group in northeast Nigeria. Some Nigerian Christians near Jos responded with self-sacrificing compassion to provide a refuge, "The House of Recab", now sheltering a couple hundred of these vulnerable kids.

The students of Hillcrest school have spent the last several weeks to help raise funds to support this ministry. Each class had selected a project. Cheri's 4th grade class did a car-wash with an accompanying

lemon aid stand last week for theirs. They raised the equivalent of about \$150! They also made Christmas cards and brought books to donate. Today, 80 of the kids from the shelter came to meet the kids from Hillcrest, to receive the gifts, and to sing Christmas carols together. The tragic stories of these kids, and their new hope through



Christ's love, had a noticeable impact on Cheri's students. A great practical example of the impact of what Christmas is all about.

There are children in the world being raised homeless, neglected by parents unable to care for themselves, much less their children-children valued for their ability to garner a pittance of pity begging

in urban night spots.

Joe and Viya Stoltenow hope to extend love and hope to some of these. A bath, a meal, a chance to go to school, a hug, and introducing them to a loving God who came, in Jesus, for kids just like them.



Dale traveled to Cambodia last month to see Joe & Viya, learn about their mission vision, and see how GLO can help. We were happy to connect with the Lutheran church in Battambang (started 13 years ago from Trinty Lutheran Church, Stockton, CA). Christians remain a small minority in Cambodia, but for now at least there is an opening to share the Gospel in this land dominated by Buddhism.


Joe & Viya are making preparations for the work to commence

Dixon and Christiana are raising support for their return January. Now they need to also replace belongings and repair damages. If you can

They are not, though, surprised to encounter such troubles, knowing Satan would like to turn them back from their mission in Kisesa. They recognize even this as an opportunity to demonstrate their faith and commitment to proclaim the One who has defeated the power of the devil where many people are still needing
