Who will go?

"Numbered 1 to 227, the passenger manifest for the missing Malaysia Airlines jet is an outwardly unremarkable document."



So starts an AP news article on flight MH370 before continuing to consider that behind the list of names.

"are 227 unique stories, part of a rich human tapestry ... There were middle-aged Australians with wanderlust, an acclaimed Chinese calligrapher, a young Indonesian man heading to begin a new career, and two people traveling on stolen passports."

My thought was: 227 souls precious and loved by God. How many of them—with their surely compelling

life histories--knew that the Son of God had given his life for them? How many had found forgiveness, peace and life eternal by entrusting their lives to him? How many did not? How many had ever known a Christian believer who would share Christ's love with them? In places like Malaysia and China, the chances are not good.

And then we wonder: What of the "passenger list" on planet Earth?

There is such good news for all, but is it getting out?

Jesus knew some communities would be closed to the message of the seventy-two, but he sent them out anyway (Luke 10).

Jesus revealed in the parable that some of the seed will fall on non-receptive souls, but the seed is still to be sown (Matt. 13).

Indeed, the promised persecution (John 15:20) awaiting the messengers of the Gospel makes it clear that God's great design for mission outreach *is not a "safe" venture*.

But still, all the same, knowing this

to be true and in spite of it all,

-He STILL assigns us to be His "witnesses" (Acts 1:8),

-we CONTINUE to be as vital to the world as "salt" and "light" (Mat. 5),

-and we are YET chosen to "declare the praises of him who called [us] out of darkness into his wonderful light" (1 Pet 2:9).

To an often unreceptive and hostile world -- of every tribe and nation -- God sends messengers of Law and Gospel.

I recall a chorus sung in Nigeria:
Here am I, Lord Jesus.
Here am I, send me.
To the fields of harvest,
Here am I, send me.

It echoes the prophet Isaiah's words when God sought a messenger: "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" Who will go?

Will you go?

Or do you know someone wanting to go?

Will you help another go?

Some specific needs for missionaries:

- Medical doctor in Tanzania at a Lutheran hospital (near Mwanza)
- ICT person to work with mission arm of the Evangelical Ethiopian Church Mekane Yesus
- Nurse, community health worker, or lab tech: Lutheran School of Health Tech Nigeria
- Project director in Botswana with the Lutheran Church in Southern Africa,
- Director for GLO's Student Mission Experience engaging university students in crosscultural misson service opportunities.

There are several other needs also (including in South Sudan - see other side), but whatever it may be, if someone feels led by God to go and serve, wherever in the world you are coming from, we are here to help match you with a mission opportunity where you can witness to God's love in Christ.
