We are excited to announce that we are preparing to help send some missionaries to assist the Lutheran Church in Southern Africa (LCSA) in their outreach efforts in Botswana.

From West Africa: The Gbeanquois

Dixon and Christiana Gbeanquoi will be serving in the capital city, Gabarone, working with outreach to university students and the urban community in general.



As God is the one who is bringing this about, only He knows fully how He has uniquely prepared Dixon, a Liberian, and Christy, a Nigerian, for the work he has set before them in Gabarone. His greatest resources are His people, and when His Holy Spirit works in them a passion to go and be his witnesses, we rejoice in the surprising ways in which He extends His kindom! Dixon, who fled Liberia's civil war as a refugee to Ghana, ended up in Nigeria to study to be a pastor and, especially, as missionary. Christy met him there and together they have set their hearts on serving God as missionaries declaring the Good News in Word and deed!

From Concordia University Texas: Liz Callahan

As the Lord of the harvest, Christ can lay it on anyone's heart - anywhere - to be eager and ready to serve him in crosscultural mission. Liz Callahan is another young lady who loves her Savior and is eager for oth-

ers to know his salvation too. She has completed studies for Director of Christian Education, and now, with guidance from



Concordia Univ., is going to Botswana under GLO's "Student Mission Experience."

She will be supporting mission outreach both among the Tswana and the Bushmen populations. It will be great experience for her before she continues, God willing, further studies in nursing, with a view to further missionary service in the future.

Blended learning seeks to combine personalized computer-based instruction with teacher-directed learning in one to various small groups depending on need and most effective learning style. As we are still seeking the best place from which to carry out Dale's missionary service, Cheri accepted to come back next year to teach. A lot still needs to come together before school starts again in about 7 weeks. We pray for God's guidance.

In this newsletter, we highlight a unique opportunity where Christ's members in wealthier parts of the global church can help support missionaries from poorer parts. The servants God has prepared in Africa do not lack when it comes to the gifts of the Spirit or the wealth of God's Word to distribute, but they come from churches with much less material wealth. In the Body of Christ, the diverse parts of the Body have worked together to fulfill Christ's purpose and mission to the world (2 Cor. 8-9; Phil. 4:15).

GLO seeks to help foster ways of uniting

the diverse global resources God has variously distributed from country to country. The Gbeanquois have



energetically begun to discover supporters in Nigeria. I was encouraged by their readiness to creatively explore ways to raise financial support in a country conditioned to regard themselves as recipients—not donors. Yet, it remains true that the average income in Nigeria, for example, is less than 1/25th what it is in the US. Roughly, the level of sacrifice it would take to give \$10 in Nigeria is like giving over \$250 in the US.
