

CHILE MISSION NEWS FROM JIM AND LIISA TINO

May 2019

Dear James,

(Jesus said,) "whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." (Matthew 25:40)

Who are "the least of these"? We can think of the very young, the very old, the unborn, the poor, the sick. The immigrants. The refugees. Most Christians I know have a heart for the needy and vulnerable among us and quickly act to help them when the opportunity arises. The beauty of helping the destitute is that you do so without expecting anything in return. It is an opportunity for selfless service... or should I say, Jesus-style service.

Sometimes we wonder how we can serve God: *I'm not a musician. I'm not a preacher. I'm not a Sunday School teacher.* Jesus identified himself very clearly with the needy in our midst: "...you do so unto *Me*." When we help someone in need, we are serving Jesus. Directly. Personally. What can you do to serve Jesus? A listening ear. A friendly invitation. A looser grip on the wallet. An introduction to the right person. The least of these... Cesar's story

Although the rehab center is located at our sister congregation in Santiago, we are very much involved as well. Liisa goes twice a week to lead classes and Jim participates in devotions and other activities. One of the "clients", or students, who has impacted us is Cesar.

Cesar's life began in unfavorable conditions. His mother had been raped. It was a complicated birth resulting in lack of oxygen that caused him to be born with cerebral palsy. He was neglected until an aunt reached out and began to care for him. Despite this rough beginning, Cesar has a positive, hopeful outlook on life!

He is now 33 years old and is realizing his dream to be a motivational speaker. The teachers and therapists at our rehab center have worked with him to be able to communicate this message of hope and confidence in Christ as a public speaker. His "charla" (message) is entitled "Surfing the Waves", and he has presented it to school children, youth, and groups of adults about ten different times so far. His testimony speaks volumes as to the grace of God!

explains that she has found the solution in Jesus! She tells them how God has worked in her life and tells them about "the family" of support that she has found at our church. Many of them visit our service or a special activity!

And then there's Sandi! This 6-year-old girl lives at our mission house while her mother works as a nanny during the week. She is a happy, imaginative and energetic little first grader. When her older sister asks her to do something, she is obedient and respectful. When she comes home from school, she runs around to greet everyone in the house. AND, whenever there is an activity at the church, she is there to chat and lend a hand. On more than one occasion mothers have been impressed when their child spends time playing with Sandi,
