When you hear them sound a long blast on the trumpets, have the whole army give a loud shout; then the wall of the city will collapse and the army will go up, everyone straight in.


(Joshua 6:5)

During the month of September Chile celebrates its Independence Day (Sept. 18, 1810) with many special activities, foods, dances and vacation days! Throughout the country there are many opportunities to go to a FONDA. This is like a county fair with food and beverages to purchase, typical games for children to play, and presentations made by folk music and dance groups. Originally, the fonda included a rodeo, but today there are choreographed demonstrations of different breeds of horses. Last year we even saw a brass band mounted on horseback! Many people wear traditional "huaso", or cowboy, outfits. The fonda is a fun place for families to celebrate their "Chilenidad"!

We know that many of you, our mission partners, are wondering how things are working out in the new location, the "Lions Club property"! Well... they aren't. When Jim went to sign the rental contract, he had the unpleasant surprise of finding that a lot of the details which had previously been agreed upon were not in the contract, and other details that he could not agree to were in it! He felt that he could not sign in good conscience, and walked away from the deal.


