Moveable Chapel Project

A moveable chapel? Well... the Old Testament nation of Israel had a moveable chapel called a "tabernacle" that they carried with them in their desert wanderings. We don't plan to be wandering Santiago from week to week, HOWEVER, since our ministry location is rented, we don't know how long we will be here! We don't want to build something and then - if we have to move - lose our investment. Thus, a moveable chapel!

Our first step was to build a solid floor, like a cement patio. (That part isn't moveable!) The floor cost about \$800



and used up all of our funds. Walls, a roof, and electrical will cost about another \$4,000. For now, we are worshipping under canopies (see next article) as we wait for the Lord's provision, and we know that He will provide! Providing a space for worship is an important part of our ministry to immigrants. Hail causes damage

Due to covid-19 restrictions, we have to hold worship services outdoors for now. With our new cement patio (see previous article), we bought some canopies and were all set! Until a freak summer hailstorm, that is. It was disappointing to have our canopies



ruined after just two weeks of outdoor services on our new floor! True, they were not high-quality canopies, but they cost us about \$50 each. And the hail was big!

Medicine for Venezuela project blesses thousands!



Pictured above is about half of one shipment. Each box contains approximately 1000 - 1500 pills.

The country of Venezuela - where we served as missionaries for 13 years - continues going from bad to worse. Wages are now two dollars per MONTH. For the past three years, we have been supporting our Venezuelan brothers and sisters by sending life-sustaining and (in some cases) life-saving medicine from Chile. A typical shipment serves about 1000 patients with a month or more supply of their medications.

Medicines are distributed through the network of 21 Lutheran congregations in Venezuela. Since many of our members in Santiago are Venezuelan immigrants, this project is near and dear to our hearts. Unfortunately, this may have been our last shipment as funding for the project has been exhausted. Each shipment costs about \$10,000, or about \$10 per patient. MICHIGAN: March 27 - April 20 (Sundays available: March 28, April 11 and 18). ARIZONA/CALIFORNIA: April 21 - May 10 (Sundays available: April 25, May 2 and 9).

FLORIDA: May 11 - June 7 (Sundays available: May 9 and 23, June 6). NEW ENGLAND: June 7 - June 21 (Sundays available: June 13, and 20).

- *We pray for the families of those who have lost loved ones to corona virus; specifically, Elianeth, Jim's assistant in Santiago, whose mother passed away in Venezuela.
- *We thank the Lord for new missionaries who have accepted God's call to serve in different parts of the world. We ask that the Lord provide for their funding.
- *Thank God for a new group of immigrants that are now housed at the mission site (10 in all!). Pray that their lives will changed by hearing the Word and seeing God's mercy at work.
- *Join us in praying for Paul (Bo) and Barb Brink who have agreed to come and "fill in" at the mission while we are in the USA visiting you all!

RAIN CAUSES DESTRUCTION

If you like the sun, Santiago, Chile is a good place for you! Of course, in the winter it's plenty cold, but it is seldom cloudy. It only rains 37 days in the year, on average! The dry season is from October through March, so it was very unusual that last week, on January 29, record amounts of rain fell! (Yes, the same day of the hailstorm - see above article). January can be the hottest month of the year, but last weekend it cooled off to the 50's as the metropolitan region received more than 31 mm of rain, the largest summer rainfall in Santiago since 1933! Now that's only a bit over 1 inch, but in a 24-hour time period that can cause a lot of destruction



in dry, desert-like conditions. Rivers overflowed their borders, there were landslides in the

mountainous areas and communities south of the capital reported many homes damaged by mud and water. Since we recently received a donation of quilts from Lutheran World Relief, we were able to provide some quilts to one of affected communities. Pray for Chile as it dries out and aid is offered to those affected.

We continue to be deeply appreciative of your partnership in the Gospel as together we press ahead with the tasks to which the Lord has called us! Your prayers, words of encouragement, and support are what keeps God's mission in Santiago going!
